

Welcome to the group visitor information for Castle Rushen. Here you will find everything you need to plan a visit.



One of the best preserved medieval castles in Europe can be found in the heart of Castletown, the Isle of Man's ancient capital. Castle Rushen was the former seat of the Kings and Lords of Mann, with the Castle's oldest part dating back to the time of Magnus, last Norse King of Mann. Later on, Castle Rushen served as an administrative centre, a mint, a law court and for over 100 years until the late 19th century, as a prison. Today, spectacular displays illustrate the Castle at various times in history with figures in period costume, historical furnishings and wall hangings, realistic food, contemporary music and medieval speech bringing the Castle's medieval and 17th century periods to life.

- The castle guards in their vaulted rooms
- Panoramic views of Castletown from the ramparts
- Gatehouse with en-suite 'garderobe'

- Medieval kitchen
- Wall walks

Pre-booked group* £11.00 per adult

*To qualify for the pre-booked group rate, groups must consist of at least 15 people and be paid for at least 7 days in advance.

Holiday passes providing multi-site admission can be booked in advance at a discounted group rate of £30 per adult and are also available at the standard price of £35 per adult from all Manx National Heritage sites. Holiday Pass admission is only permitted on production of a valid card. Cards are valid for the named person and are not transferable. ID may also be requested. Free access is for 14 days from the first day of use on a Holiday.

A combined Go Explore Heritage card is also available to groups of 20 or more which offers, during normal operating times, unlimited access to Manx National Heritage sites and unlimited travel on the heritage railways, buses and Douglas horse trams for up to 5 days.


Free admission is available to children under 18 years of age, persons accompanying a disabled visitor, Members of the Friends of Manx National Heritage and organisations holding an agreement with Manx National Heritage. Entry available to the named member only on presentation of a valid membership card. Restrictions may apply. For details on our reciprocal arrangements, please consult your membership handbook.

Booking in advance is recommended and achieves a number of benefits for your group including a discount on the standard admission price and speedy, hassle-free entry to the site. How to get there

Castle Rushen is situated in the centre of Castletown, overlooking the harbour.

By road - Either enter the town via the Douglas Road (from the North) and follow Victoria Road into Castletown, crossing the harbour bridge. From the South enter Castletown from Alexandra Road and follow the road until you enter Castletown square.

By Steam Railway - Castle Rushen is signposted from Castletown station.

Parking

Disc zone car parking is available within the town. Coaches may drop off or collect visitors at Castletown town square. Free coach parking is available in the area behind the George Hotel, adjacent to Castletown fire station on Farrants Way. Please note that speed limits apply in Castletown and there are narrow streets within the town.
