

Welcome to the group visitor information for Cregneash. Here you will find everything you need to plan a visit.



Cregneash is a living illustration of a farming and crofting community in the 19th and early 20th century. You will see tiny thatched cottages dotted around the village, plough horses, Loaghtan sheep, shorthorn cows, pigs and Manx cats. Nestling under Meayll Hill and overlooking the Calf of Man, this picturesque village was the first open air folk museum in the British Isles. The village now forms a centre for traditional farming practices and skills.

## Opening hours 2024

Open from 28th March - 3rd November 2024, 10am - 4.30pm. Last entry 4pm

Admission is by ticket or Group Booking Permit which provides entry to the entire village. Group Booking Permits should be handed in by your coach driver or guide on arrival at the Village Shop. Your group will be asked to wear a wrist band for the duration of their visit.

## Timing your visit

A typical visit lasts between 1 to 1½ hours. Manx National Heritage recommends that a visit to Cregneash is timed to coincide with a visit to the Sound, which is situated nearby.

## Admission prices for 2024

Pre-booked group\* £8.50 per adult

\*To qualify for the pre-booked group rate, groups must consist of at least 15 people and be paid for at least 7 days in advance.

Holiday passes providing multi-site admission can be booked in advance at a discounted group rate of £30 per adult and are also available at the standard price of £35 per adult from all Manx National Heritage sites. Holiday Pass admission is only permitted on production of a valid card. Cards are valid for the named person and are not transferable. ID may also be requested. Free access is for 14 days from the first day of use on a Holiday.

A combined Go Explore Heritage card is also available to groups of 20 or more which offers, during normal operating times, unlimited access to Manx National Heritage sites and unlimited travel on the heritage railways, buses and Douglas horse trams for up to 5 days.

Free admission is available to children under 18 years of age, persons accompanying a disabled visitor, Members of the Friends of Manx National Heritage and organisations holding an agreement with Manx National Heritage. Entry available to the named member only on presentation of a valid membership card. Restrictions may apply. For details on our reciprocal arrangements, please consult your membership handbook.

Coach drivers and guides accompanying a group receive free admission to all Manx National Heritage sites.

## Booking your visit

Pre-booking is advised and achieves a number of benefits for your group including a substantial discount on the standard admission price and speedy, hassle-free entry to the site. ## How to get there

By coach and by road: Cregneash is situated on the A31 Sound Road.

By bus: from Port Erin at weekends only. Please refer to timetables at [www.iombusandrail.im](http://www.iombusandrail.im)

On foot: Cregneash can be accessed via public footpath from the Chasms and Head Road.

Coach parking and Coach travel information: Coach parking facilities are available at the Quarry Car Park, signposted at Cregneash. There is no charge for coach parking. There is a two minute walk from the car park to Cregneash via public footpath.
