Welcome to Isle of Man Heritage Open Days 2026

Across two inspiring weekends, venues across the Island will open their doors for Heritage Open Days, the annual festival of discovery organised by Manx National Heritage.

In its seventeenth year, this much-loved annual festival celebrates the Isle of Man's unique history, culture and community spirit, offering behind-the-scenes access and insights into remarkable places, special experiences and hidden stories that surprise and delight, including many buildings and landmarks not normally open to the public.

This year's programme features exciting new additions, including vintage bus tours run by Bus Vannin and Jurby Transport Museum to mark 50 years since the nationalisation of the Island's bus service.

Visitors can also enjoy a sculptural stroll through Douglas and St John's with the Isle of Man Arts Council; discover fascinating 'Stories in the Stones' at Kirk Andreas, showcasing some of the most impressive medieval crosses on the Isle of Man; explore the work that takes place behind the scenes at Manx National Heritage, or uncover the curious connection between Cronk Howe Moor (Fairy Hill) and the Bayeux Tapestry.

Many popular favourites also return, including tours of Government House State Rooms, behind-the-scenes visits to the Gaiety Theatre, opportunities to explore the workshops and steam sheds of the Isle of Man Railway, and special tours of Okell's Brewery. Also, with plenty of events taking place in the countryside, Heritage Open Days is the perfect opportunity to get out and experience the Island in all its autumnal glory.

There is something for everyone in this year's Heritage Open Days programme, which opens doors, sparks curiosity and invites people of all ages to experience the Isle of Man, with all events completely free of charge.

We extend our sincere thanks to the dedicated support of inspiring contributors and volunteers who generously give their time and expertise – and to you for participating in this special event.

We look forward to welcoming you to Heritage Open Days 2026.

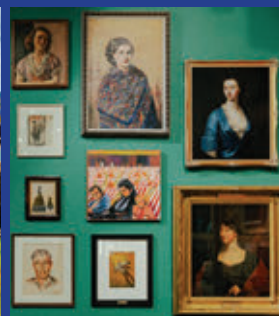

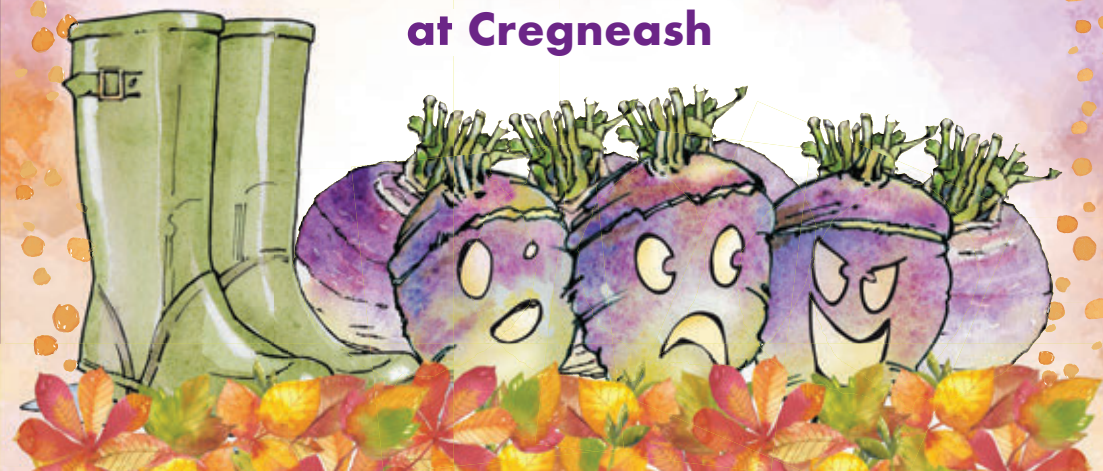

24. Behind the Doors at Douglas City Hall

Step inside Douglas City Hall and explore its public spaces, including the Council Chamber, Committee Room and Mayor's Parlour. See the Letters Patent Presented by Queen Camilla in 2024 and learn more about Douglas's civic history and heritage. The event also offers bookable guided tours of lesser-known areas of City Hall, including the original fire station, drawing room, former library, caretaker's flat and basement.



25. Guided Tour of Douglas Bridge Control Building

Join historian Charles Guard for a rare opportunity to see inside this extraordinary Victorian building. Discover the original engine and giant accumulator installed in 1895, which powered the Douglas Harbour swing bridge. Much of the machinery remains in situ.



26. Great Walls of Laxey Guided Walk

Join historian Charles Guard for a rare opportunity to explore the extraordinary dry-stone walls of the Laxey Valley. Built on an enormous scale, their origins remain something of a mystery.
